Just recently, Tel Aviv University launched the multidisciplinary <u>Center for Climate Change Action</u>, and now two exhibitions on campus tackle these exact issues.

The Plan(e)t exhibition at TAU's <u>Genia Schreiber University Art Gallery</u> places plants at its heart, portraying their valuable contribution to our survival on Earth through a series of projects which integrate scientific research with artistic endeavour. This thought-provoking exhibition recently became the first university gallery in Israel ever to have been shortlisted by the International Council of Museums for the UMAC Award for Best Exhibition. But that's not the only environmental exhibition on campus right now. The <u>Steinhardt Museum of Natural History's</u> new temporary exhibit, "It's Warming Up: The Climate, the Crisis and Us", shows the latest scientific findings on the environment crisis, in Israel and around the world, displayed using interactive exhibits.
